




Equality means.....




- dealing with every student in the same way

The outcome for Equality is




passing at all levels

Equality, Diversity & Inclusion

Acknowledging the huge differences inherent in every student is the notion behind **diversity**

Ensuring that each student feels valued and acknowledged instead of isolated is the practice behind **inclusion**

Equality


STRANDS OF EQUALITY (9 PROTECTED CHARACTERISTICS)


