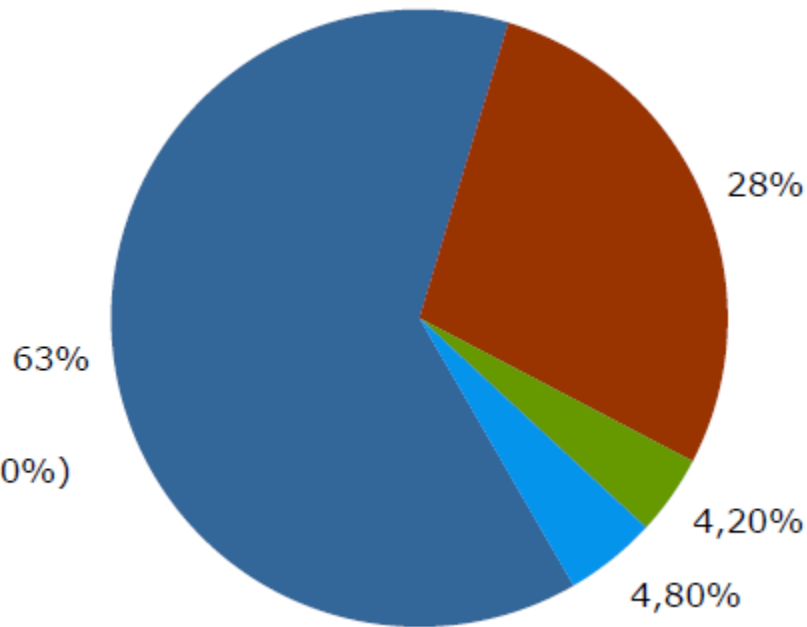
The total budget for the period 2014-2020 is **14.7 billion euros.**

■ Funds to be redistributed between KA1 and KA2 (4,80%)





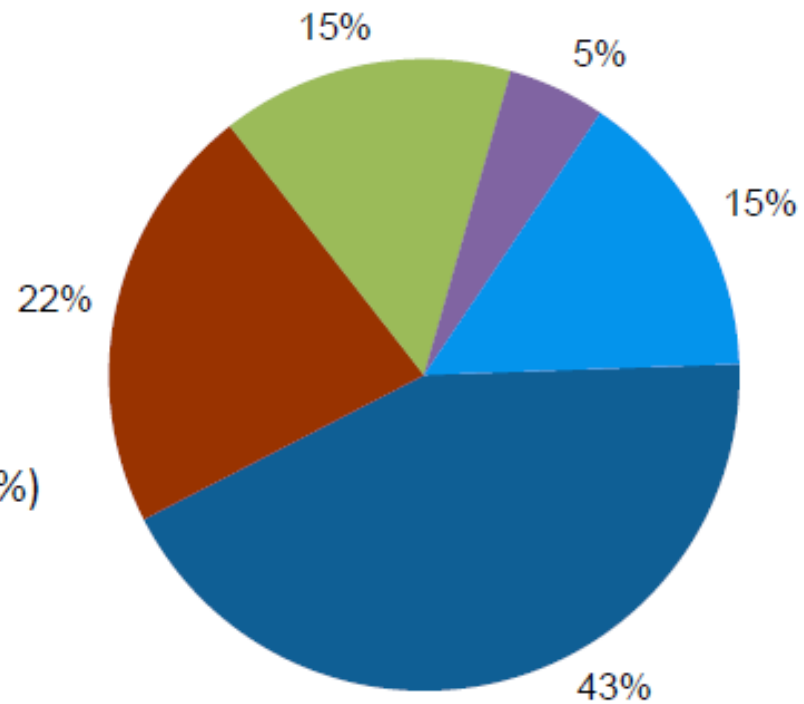
The Budget 2/2

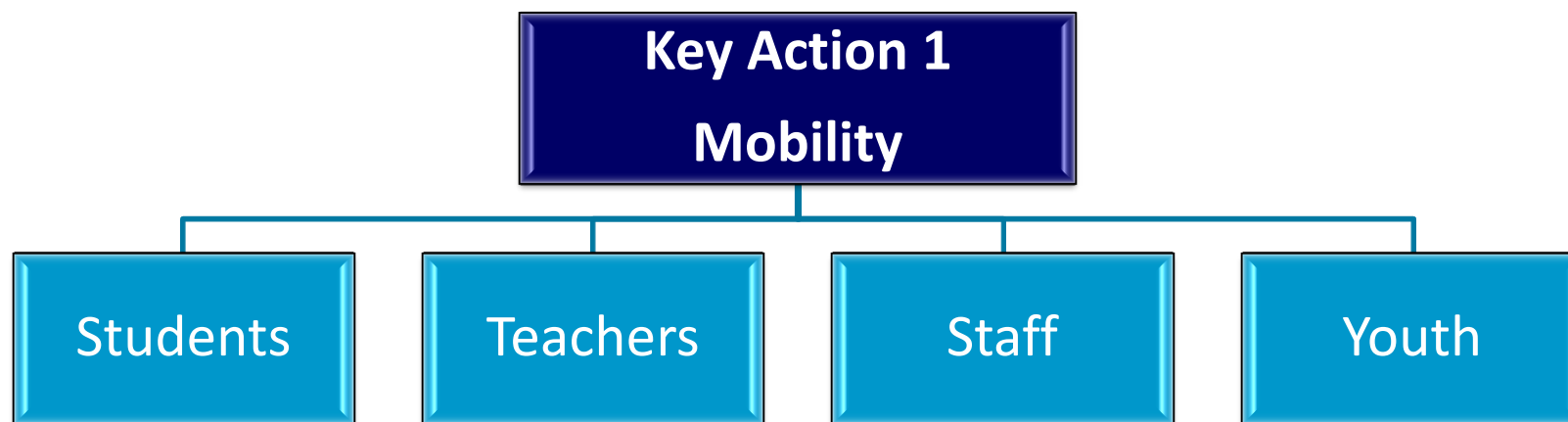

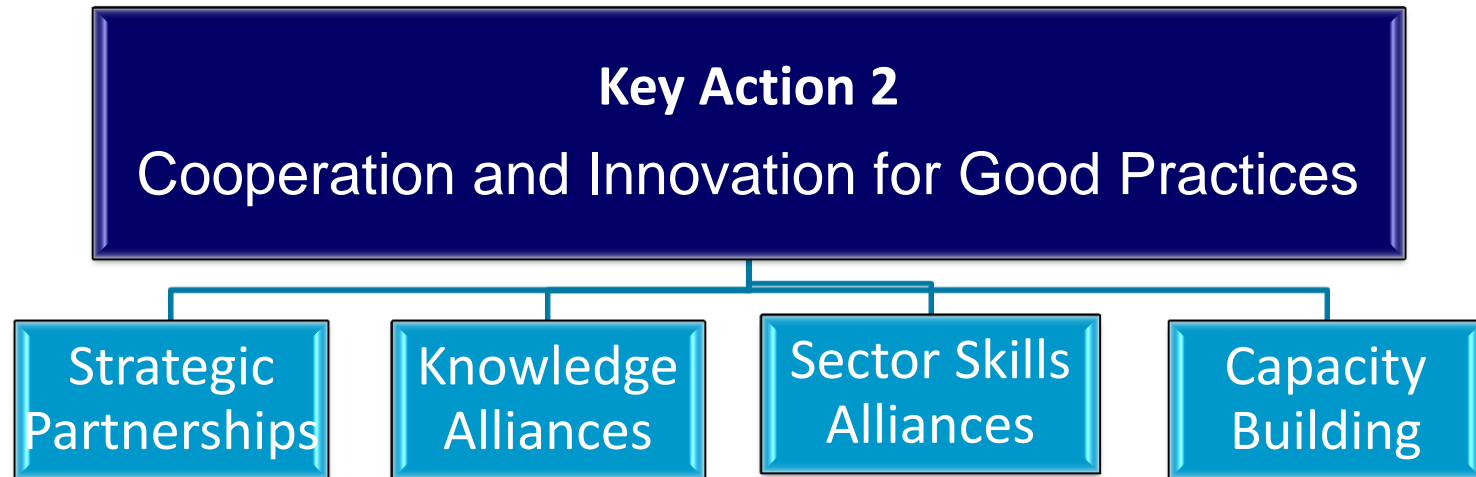

KA 2 - Strategic Partnerships

Objectives



Strategic partnerships aim to support:

- the promotion of cooperation and exchanges
- the development of innovative practices

2 types of Strategic Partnerships:

- **Small Scale Projects -> Exchanges of good practices**
- **Large Scale Projects -> Development of Innovation**



Horizontal Priorities:

- Improve achievements in basic and transversal competences
- Inclusive Education
- Innovative Education
- Professional development of educators
- Transparency and recognition of skills and qualifications

Large Scale Projects

300 000 Euro (2 years projects)

450 000 Euro (3 years projects)

Small Scale Projects

6 000 euro per year for the project coordinator

3 000 euro per year for the project partner

travel/accommodation/subsistence costs are also covered.



The award criteria used to assess Erasmus+ KA2 Strategic Partnership projects are:

- Relevance (max. 30 points)
- Quality of the project design (max. 20 points)
- Quality of the project team (max. 20 points)
- Impact and Dissemination (max. 30 points)



KA 2 – Knowledge Alliances

Objectives



Knowledge Alliances projects aim to:

- Promote innovation
- Promote entrepreneurship
- Promote cooperation between HE and enterprises

Key features of Knowledge Alliances are: Innovation; Sustainability; Impact.

Objectives and Funded Actions



Support HEI in the eligible Partner Countries as far as concerns:

- modernisation and internationalisation
- cooperation with EU HEI
- intercultural awareness and understanding



KA 2 – Capacity Building in HE

Priorities



Depending on the partner countries involved in the project, national, regional priorities are defined

Four categories of priorities are proposed:

- Curriculum development;
- Improving quality of education and training;
- Improving management of higher education institutions;
- Developing the higher education sector within society at large.



Two categories of Capacity-building projects are supported:

1) Joint Projects

Addressed directly to HEI.

2) Structural Projects

Aimed at producing an impact on HE systems.



For National projects:

At least 6 HEI

- 3 in the Partner country
- 3 from three different Programme countries

For multi-country projects:

At least 7 HEI

- 4 in the Partner countries (at least 2 HEI in each partner country)
- 3 from three different Programme countries

The LeTS portal has been developed in the framework of the LeTS: Language eTeacher Services project funded by the Leonardo da Vinci programme. The functionalities and the didactical resources have been improved and increased in the framework of the LeTS GO Project funded by the Leonardo da Vinci – Transfer of Innovation Programme.

The portal target group are teachers of foreign languages.

The aim of this portal is to :

- promote the application of new technologies to language teaching and learning
- allow the sharing and exchange of elearning materials for the teaching of European languages.

From the LeTS portal, it is possible to access to:

- **Training Package** which focuses on the application of elearning in a language teaching context. The training package contains 4 on line courses addressed to language teachers willing to make an effective use of new technologies in language teaching.
- **Database of Products** containing electronic based language teaching and learning materials. The database contains more than 800 elearning based language teaching and learning products which were evaluated by language teachers at secondary school and university levels based in 8 European countries. The products contained on the database can be used for the teaching and learning of 18 different European languages.
- **Database of Experiences**, containing a collection of elearning experiences in the framework of foreign language teaching. The database contains more than 300 experiences of making use of elearning in a language teaching context. The experiences described were carried out by language teachers at secondary school and university levels based in 8 European countries.
- **Tools Section** from where it is possible to access to an interactive evaluation questionnaire to evaluate elearning based products (e.g. CD Rom, on line courses etc.) and to access to a collection of online sources useful to create elearning based materials.

What is it History On Line?
History On Line is an international web portal for professional and non-professional historians, focusing on the History of Education.

The Portal is organised in three main section where professionals and amateurs historians can find different materials to carry out historical research through the exploitation of information technologies and Internet :

Building History On Line Section - Collecting and making available for historians research instruments, like Direct Sources (**Classics of Education** and **Digital Archives**), **Bibliography** and **webliography** and an example of Meta Research Engine (**MultiOpac**) allowing researches in three Archives of School Textbooks (MANES for Spain, EDISCO for Italy and EMMANUELLE for France)

Studying History On Line Section - Giving access to an Educational Package on Historical Research a real Guide for the studying of history through the exploitation of information technologies and Internet

Writing History On Line Section - Collecting and making available sample Essay, which have been written by making use of the portal resources.

Which goals does it want to reach?
History On Line would like to encourage the historical research by professional and non-professional historians, to facilitate the availability and reproducibility of primary historical sources, to offer new tools for qualitative and quantitative analysis, to promote the integration between researchers coming from different European countries, to promote new ways of writing history online, and to make resources on the history of education and didactics accessible to teachers and secondary school students.

Who works at the web portal?
History On Line brings together a **pool of Universities** from various European countries, which collaborate closely and contribute equally to the development of the different sections contents of the portal.

This Portal is the result of the History On Line project funded by the Lifelong Learning Programme - Erasmus Sub Programme - Multilateral Project Action.
