
EGPS SCHEME

- □ To embed a practical work placement within each translation course enabling the student to gain real life experience of the profession, including work shadowing a professional.
- ☐ To offer curriculum models that incorporate the option for practical work experience, enhancing students' prospects in the international job market.
- ☐ To give students experience of a commercial environment in another country, giving them overseas work experience and increasing their mobility prospects.
- □ To establish key Learning Outcomes for translation students.
- ☐ To develop a form of accreditation for work placements linked to these outcomes.





WHAT ARE THE AIMS OF THE EUROPEAN GRADUATE PLACEMENT SCHEME (EGPS)? (2)

- □ To benefit companies by obtaining a native speaker for a period of time to help their business.
- ☐ To offer professional development to a translation employer's staff through mentoring activities.
- □ To improve the performance and employability of the students.
- ☐ To increase the level of mobility of students and staff engaged in translation courses.
- ☐ To promote more partnerships between Higher Education (HE) institutions and employers.






