



## From the Tour of Babel to Internet: Educate Humanity to Peace Restoring Communication

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### Abstract

The myth of the confusion of languages, and the parallel dream of the research/recovery of a (holy, or perfect, or still universal) language, inherits the history of humanity, from the ancient to the contemporary times [7]. Aim of the contribute is to frame the question in its historical context [2]: also re-reading the words of the great pedagogist Comenius, on one side [8], and investigating, on the other one, the eloquent esperantic experiment [3], we will underline how the modern proposal of Internet not only is not against multilingualism and multiculturalism (differently from other aspects and problems of the present globalisation [4, 11]), but it contributes, by restauring and increasing communication [1, 5, 6], to the protection and promotion of a linguistic ecology (as thought from the pioneers [9] to the newest scholars [10]), educating humanity to peace and helping in developing his well-being. Through it, the fracture is recomposed and the ethical proposal of the “hospitalité langagière” [12] is concretely renewed and realized.

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
