She developed the online and hybrid versions of Beginning Spanish. In addition to teaching at UNR, she has also taught at the University of Iowa, the University of Minnesota, UIUC, the Universitat de Barcelona, and as a visiting Associate Professor at Sonoma State University.

She is a co-author for the 9th edition of McGraw-Hill's Beginning Spanish textbook Puntos de Partida and is currently writing an Intermediate Level Spanish textbook with John Wiley & Sons Publishing.
