










# The relevance of cinema to older adults in an ageing society:

The "competencies" both depend on how the societies and communities support active ageing, as the capabilities of the individuals themselves!


Model of competencies for active ageing

Competencies	Definition
Learning	Learning opportunities, updating and capacity development, creative learning and training in new technologies. Autodidactism
Civic & community	Participation in voluntary or paid work activities for the welfare of others and society
Health	Mantenance of well-being in old age, in its physical, mental and social components
Emocional	Preservation of autonomy and dignity in old age, developing meaningful social and emotional connections, which provide care and support within the family or community.
Financial / Economic	Aspects of the economic environment that have a particular impact on active aging and the safety of older individuals (income, pensions, social protection)
Technology	Access and use of technology, including computers, mobile phones and other applications - social networking, e-communication, e-learning.

### **Andragogic model centered** on the older adult

#### Course

Enables older learners shooting their own short-films based on self-reflection on the issues of ageing and the identification of appropriate strategies for a more active

New learning plus reflection on real and ficitional experiences and Older learner based learning sharing in small groups of peers, facilitate understanding of how reality is influenced by past expriences, the current perceptions and expectations for the future. When experiences are meaningful becomes easier to choose new ways of being and acting! Cinema helps establishing rapport and significant commitments to aspects of the ageing process more active and healthy!
