





OUP's five clusters of global skills

- Include a visit to the University of Florida / Newcastle. What's interesting or special about the university? How many international students study there? How does that compare to the University of Klagenfurt? How do you think international students affect university life?
- Design some learning activities about intercultural competence/citizenship to be completed on excursion.
- Present everything on your website.

Project 4: US election


- Design five learning activities that emphasise critical and creative thinking about the topic "US elections 2020."




