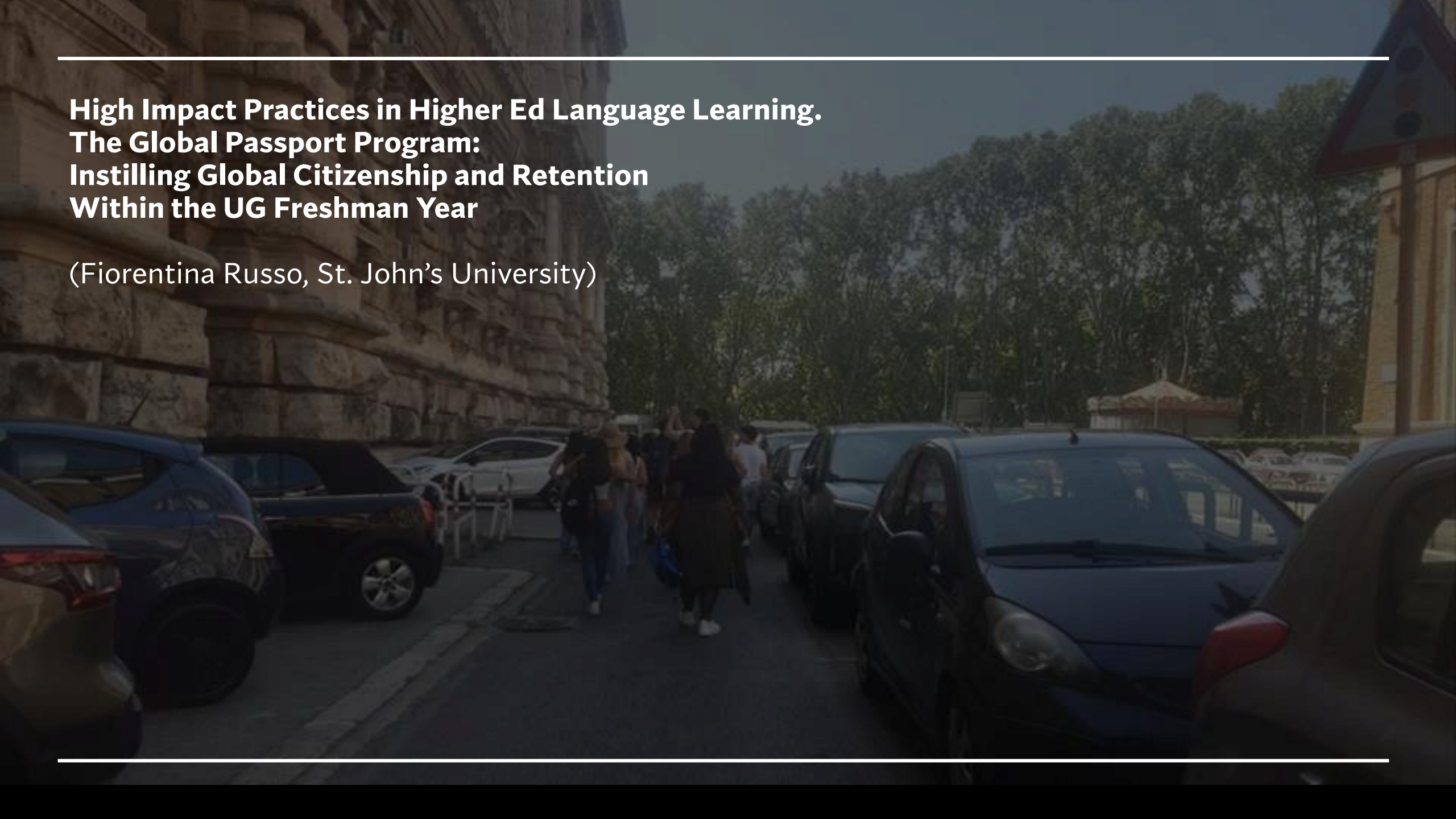

# What is Global Passport?

- Short term study abroad program (Rome/Paris campus) (roughly 8 days);
- HIP (High Impact Practice) component to a normal core UG course offered in the freshman year;
- Students from 5-6 classes comprise the entire cohort

**Don't Forget to Go Inside Churches!**


