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Selected factors affecting education today:

- the conservative turn in global politics and education (field of education as a proxy cultural war)
- rise of new and yet still unexplored IT technologies (Al and ChatGPT in particular)
- -generational gap represented by the skills and expectations of Generation Z and Generation Alpha; hybrid identities of modern teenegers as a challenge
- global economic factors and geopolitical situation of today and near future



Three types of global communities:

- 1) Community of trade
- 2) Community of law
- 3) Community of autonomous communities



Case study of educational effectiveness: International Universal Bilingual Education Program (Bilingual Future)



- education starts from birth and is most effective in the critical period (age 0-7)
- effective preschool education is key to bilingual success
- bilingual competencies equal to native one's can be acquired through the linguistic immersion in the second language
- autonomy has to be given to teachers and educational institutions
- cooperation and bottom-up actions can introduce real educational innovations
- English as a second language is a starting point for future competencies in other fields



Proposed directions of national schooling systems reforms:

- increase of autonomy, cooperation and academic freedom for teachers and local institutions
- increase of cooperation level with local authorities and regional governments as a response to local needs
- implementation of universal bilingualism (with English as a second language for example) as a key future competence
- implementation of pedagogical innovations
- introduction of empowerment strategies for teachers and students
