# METHODS

1. Analyzing the size of a text according to the Standards;
2. The analysis of quantitative criteria of complexity of a text;
3. The analysis of qualitative criteria of complexity of a text;
4. The analysis of syntactic criteria of complexity of a text.

# THE FIESCH-KINCAID INDEX

The original formula for iFK is:

$$iFK = (0.39 * \text{sentence length} + (11.8 * \text{number of syllables in a word}) + 15.59$$

The Russian version of the iFK is:

$$iFK = (0.5 * \text{sentence length} + (8.4 * \text{number of syllables in a word}) + 15.59$$
