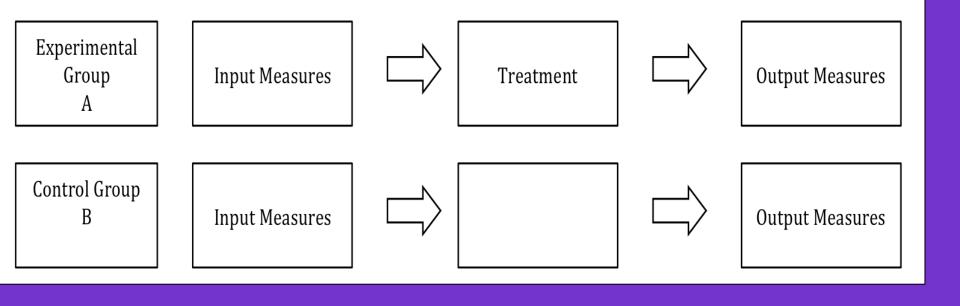

A quasi-experimental investigation with two convenience samples: a control group and the experimental group.

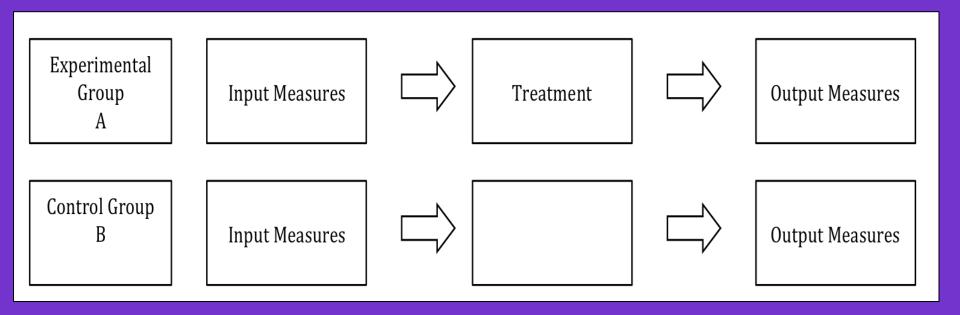

Five 30-minute sessions integrated into an Italian language course for Erasmus at an Italian university, level B1/B2



The acquisition of intercultural communication abilities passes through three phases:

Awareness, Knowledge, and Skills

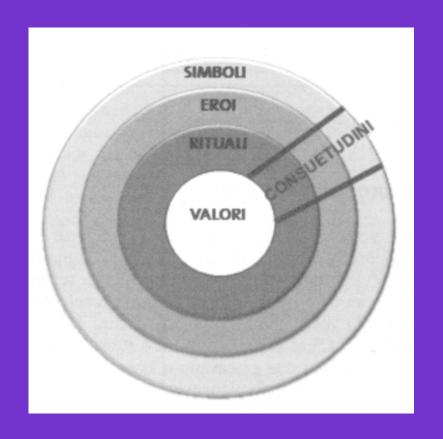
(Hofstede, Hofstede, & Minkov, 2010:419)

The experimental group will work to:

- a) Develop the awareness (of the individual values, of one's culture, of the other culture).
- b) Develop the ability to separate observation (of an event, a situation) from its interpretation.
- c) Learn to observe cultures objectively.

a) Learning activities to develop awareness

- Reflection on the concept of culture
- List of cultural heroes and the values they represent and/ or reinforce

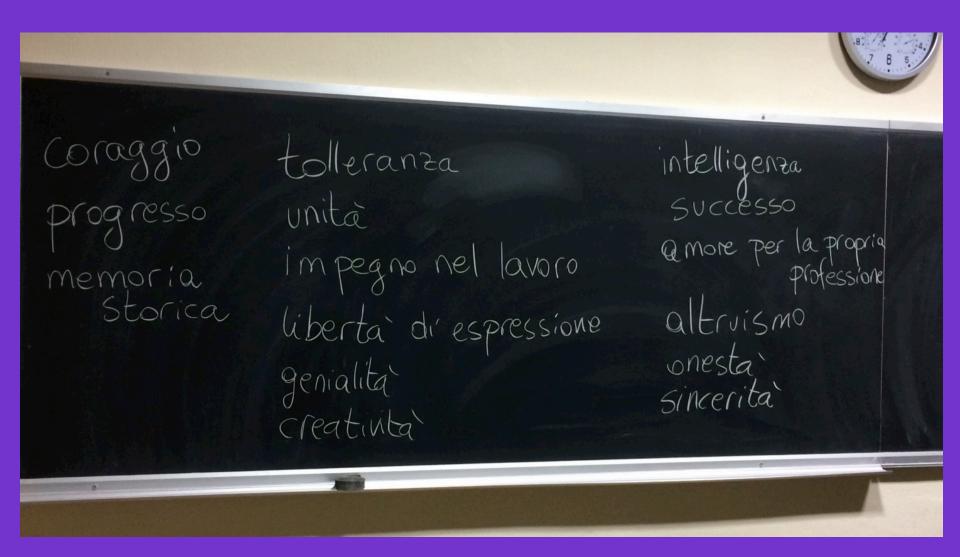

b) Learning how to separate observation from its interpretation

OBSERVATION/ DESCRIPTION
On this side of the journal, describe what you saw. Anything that strikes you as different, funny, weird, sad, etc. is appropriate. Feelings, emotions, judgements should not be expressed on this side. Just stick to the facts.

OPINION/ANALYSIS

On this side, describe your thoughts, feelings, etc. about the event. Then try to analyze why you feel this way. What in your cultural makeup may be affecting how you feel? How is that different in the new culture?

The Model of Cultural Dimensions (Hofstede & Minkov, 2010)

Basic Problem	Dimension of Culture
Hierarchy	Power Distance (from small to large)
Identity	Individualism vs Collectivism
Gender	Masculinity vs Femininity
Truth	Uncertainty Avoidance (from weak to strong)
Virtue	Long-Term vs Short-Term Orientation
Subjective Well-being	Indulgence vs Restraint

c) Learning activites to observe cultures objectively

"According to your experience in Italy so far, what aspects of Italian culture can you identify as evidence of a larger power distance or of a more collectivist culture? Make a list of at least three aspects/ behaviours that you observed or experienced first hand here in Italy "

How can we assess Intercultural Communicative Competence?

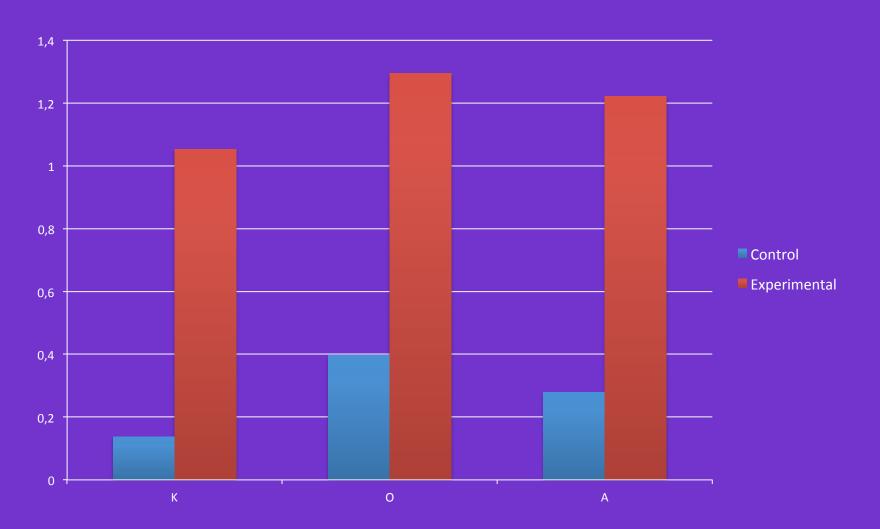
- The Intercultural Competence Assessment (INCA) portfolio (INCA Project, 2004)
- The INCA Portfolio assesses ICC in terms of 3 main components: <u>Knowledge</u>, <u>Openness</u>, and <u>Adaptability</u>
- The components are evaluated with a score of 1 to 5, based on the evaluation grid attached to the INCA Portfolio suitably adapted.

The test results

Based on the comparison of the averages of the Knowledge, Openness, and Adaptability components and on the T-test results, it can be said that the treatment favoured ICC development.

What next?

- Raise awareness among language teachers and academic administrators on ICC
- Further explore the fruitful relationship ICC – foreign language learning
- Improve ICC assessment tools
