

Benefits for Students

- Students learn best from each other (Vygotsky)
- Low affective filter
- Sense of community formation
- Questions / review
- Efficient low-stakes assessments
- Intensive practice
- Formation of online study groups



Benefits for Educators

- Frequent, individualized student feedback
- Performance notification in online textbook (idle time, time spent, attempts, etc.)
- Skill development (teaching with technology)
- More class time spent on skillusing activities, communication focus during synchronous class





Benefits for Educators

- Efficient use of instructor time (lesson planning, preparing, implementation)
- Modify content rapidly
- Reduce grading time
- Improve articulation



Teaching online perception:

- Teaching online takes more time
- 24 hours instant answer
- Immediate grading feedback
- No control of time leave aside professional activities (writing, research)
- Feeling drained

Deciding Asynchronous or Synchronous Online Courses

A. asynchronous communication communication that occurs in delayed time and does not rely on simultaneous access for educational outcomes.

B. synchronous communication as communication that involves real time communication between teachers and students.

Flexibility	Isolation
Pacing to fit personal schedule	Risk of apathy
Affordability	No classroom community
