### MODERNISATION OF JAPAN

- Threat of subjugation and unequal treaties with major Western powers, led by the US prompted Japan to modernise
- The various projects of modernity, which were forms of Westernisation, disregarded Japan's cultural identity

#### WESTERNISATION OF JAPANESE GRAMMAR



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- The Western concept of linguistics was introduced in 1886
- Rich indigenous traditions of language study continued into the early 1900s but were gradually displaced

### LANGUAGE LEARNING TIMELINES

Category I Languages: 24-30 weeks (600-750 class hours)

Languages similar to English.

- \* Danish, Dutch, Italian, Norwegian, Portuguese, Romanian and Swedish (24 weeks)
- # French and Spanish (30 weeks)

Category IV Languages: 88 weeks (2200 class hours)

"Super-hard languages - Languages which are exceptionally difficult for native English speakers.

\* Arabic, Chinese - Cantonese, Chinese - Mandarin, Japanese and Korean

Could I have an Espresso T?

Esupresso no tī ga (ii desu).

I would (very much) like an Espresso.

Esupresso no tī wa (chotto) ...


I'm not sure about Espuresso.

### CONCLUSION
