Golubovs'ka Iryna is the head of the chair of classic languages and general linguistics of Kyiv Taras Shevchenko National University (Ukraine).

She graduated in Russian Language and Literature (specialization Russian Language for Foreign Students) from Taras Shevchenko State University of Kyiv in 1979. Since then she has constantly been working in Taras Shevchenko University of Kyiv.

In 1979-1986 she has been working as Assistant Professor at the preparatory department for foreign students (chair of Russian language) of Taras Shevchenko State University of Kyiv. In 1992-2001 she has been on the post of Associate Professor of the chair of classic languages and general linguistics of philological department.

In 1989 she got Candidate degree in Philology (Ph.D.), speciality – General Linguistics after her post-graduate studies in Taras Shevchenko State University of Kyiv, chair of classic languages and general linguistics. In 2004 she got Doctoral degree in Philology, speciality – General Linguistics after her Doctoral Studies in Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv, Institute of Philology, chair of classic languages and general linguistics.

In 1996 she was invited to Tamkang University, College of Foreign Languages (Taiwan) where she has been teaching Taiwanese students Russian language and literature for about six years. In 2000 she was nominated the Best Teacher of College.

She is the author of more than 100 theoretical and instructive works in linguistics in the field of ethnic and structural linguistics, language typology, cultural linguistics, methods of instruction, etc. Her monograph "Ethnic Peculiarities of Language World Models" (Kyiv, 2002, 2004) has introduced a totally new framework in culturally engaged linguistic studies.
