

## The Higher Education Choices of Students with Asperger Syndrome

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Asperger syndrome (AS) is an autistic spectrum disorder and every year increasing number of students with the syndrome register for third level education. A person who has been diagnosed as having AS is considered to be at the higher functioning end of the spectrum, however they can have difficulty with social interaction and can experience high levels of stress and anxiety. These difficulties can create learning barriers and mar the satisfaction of their education experience.

People with AS are usually of average or above average intelligence but can often find it hard to think in abstract ways and are frequently therefore drawn to STEM subjects where the curriculum content can be objective rather than subjective.
