Tatiana Chemi is Associate Professor at Aalborg University, Chair of Educational Innovation. Her major interest is the artistic learning and creative process, which she has been inquiring in the last ten years. As a graduate in Italian Literature and Theatre and a PhD in Contemporary Theatre History, she has a deep understanding of aesthetics and artistic practices. Her Post Doc research at the Danish School of Education (DPU) led her more specifically into the field of psychology of the arts and educational theories and practices, inquiring the real benefits of the arts, especially in educational settings.

She has been a senior researcher at Universe Fonden and researcher at Universe Research Lab; a teaching assistant for the Dept. of Dramaturgy at the University of Aarhus and lecturer of History of World Literature and Visual Arts at the Scandinavian Department of the Russian Theatre School GITIS. She has organized and led several cultural projects such as the international theatre meeting "The Multicultural Space" (DK 1-9 May 2002) and the Samuel Beckett Centenary in Denmark (November 2006). She holds conferences and workshops on arts-based learning, innovation and creativity. Her past interest for the arts-in-business led her to the idea and coordination of the workshops Artbase 2005 and the collaboration to Bramstrup Performing Arts (2005).

She is author of several articles and reports, and of the books Kunsten at Integrere Kunst i Undervisningen, Aalborg Universitetsforlag, 2012 and Artbased Approaches. A Practical Handbook to Creativity at Work, Fokus Forlag, 2006. At the moment she is involved in several research projects, eg. on the outcomes of arts-based learning in pedagogue education or on museum learning. Her teaching focus is on pedagogical innovation. She is Italian, yoga-nuts and excellent cook, and has been living in Denmark since 1999.
