She lectures in the areas of Women's Health, Family Health, and on the influence of society, culture, and economic systems on health outcomes globally.

Her PhD looked at how socioeconomic factors within people (individual and demographic) and places (households, neighbourhoods, and cities) interact over time to produce inequalities in health.

She is interested in how the social, cultural, and geographic spaces that people inhabit influence their lifestyles and consequently their health and well-being. She is currently involved in research projects that use location-based applications on mobile phones and geographic information systems (GIS) to track and record how people interact with urban living environments for the purposes of physical activity.
